

Actions & Algorithms for Medical Emergencies: How To Save A Life (Including Your Own!)

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Discover three simple chair-side, non-invasive tests to help avoid an emergency;
- Recognize the most frequent life threatening emergencies and know when and why they occur;
- Review a systematic approach to treat the most common life-threatening scenarios;
- Learn how to develop a plan for the office team when dealing with a crisis event;
- Determine when to administer the essential "Top 10" emergency drugs; and
- Understand legal and moral obligations presented by medical emergencies.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A CRISIS SITUATION can – and likely will – occur at some time in your practice.

Many potential medical emergencies can be prevented. Gain a comprehensive command of the essential knowledge and skills needed to handle a life threatening medical crisis.

There are more medically compromised patients coming to our offices than ever before. Acquire "up to the minute" actions for dealing with a medical emergency while challenging preconceived or outdated ideas. Daniel Pompa, DDS – Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon, ADA Consultant and Seminar Series Speaker – discusses the prevention, preparation, recognition and management of medical emergencies. Delivered in an interactive, high energy, multi-media presentation frequently described by attendees as "highly informative", "engaging", and "exceptional". A step-by-step medical approach using basic physical diagnostic methods is reviewed, giving the attendee a clear understanding of these medical findings.

We will explore the "Conversational History" and how it will uncover medical issues not revealed by the standard health history form. Additionally, the participant will learn simple, non-invasive critical tests that can reduce overall risks. We clearly delineate indications for emergency drug use and proper dosages, as well as demonstrate how to assemble and maintain an ideal emergency drug kit. The newest techniques for drug administration will be shown for participants to hone their skills utilizing simulation models and real drugs. Dr. Pompa may incorporate live demonstrations to enhance the learning experience depending on the venue format.

MY AAP Board of Trustees Report

DR. RICHARD KAHN, AAP TRUSTEE



You have already received via email the AAP District Trustee communication containing the official Board of Trustee minutes for the Winter 2017 BOT meeting, minus the executive session information. I usually add some commentary to hopefully clarify the information, share the tenor of the Board meeting and give my personal perspective on the status of the AAP and/or

the specialty of Periodontology. I have always refrained from disclosing executive session information that was not authorized by the Board to be released. Recent developments at the AAP call to question the BOT's legal obligation to share executive session information with the entire membership.

Each year at the AAP's General Assembly, all BOT minutes subsequent to the previous year's General Assembly are published and made available in a handout so the ultimate governing body can vote to approve ALL Board actions to close the concluding year's business. Unlike any prior year's minutes, this year in San Diego a solitary executive session action, NOT authorized by the BOT to be released was included in the printed version of the yearly minutes. In contrast all other significant BOT executive session actions as well as executive session actions of the executive committee (de facto BOT for time sensitive matters only) were not included or excluded from the minutes. It was told to the Board that the non-approved

executive session information that was released was only included in the printed version/handout of the General Assembly provided minutes, not the electronic version.

In response to an inquiry about this action, the Board was informed that according to Illinois law, executive session actions are discoverable in a court of law. If this solitary executive session action was disclosed to conform to Illinois law, then the AAP not disclosing all the remaining volume of discoverable BOT executive session material and the executive committee executive session material places the AAP in violation of such Illinois law. My research shows this "act to conform" disclosure was a first. On March 24, 2017 it was stated that a written response would be provided to the Trustees before the BOT meeting on May 5-6, 2017.

Having been cultured in the NJDA, I strongly believe that ALL members have a right to know all organizational information, save for that which is protected by the rules of executive session confidentiality. As a Trustee I have an obligation to share all information that is permitted. The recent developments discussed above are very different than my prior experiences during close to forty years of involvement in organized dentistry and organized periodontics. It is always my intention to make sure that everyone is versed on what happens during the AAP Board of Trustees meetings. If lawful governance requires confidential executive session disclosure, my next report will be rather lengthy.

After graduating from New York University College of Dentistry in 1978, Dr. Pompa completed a General Practice Residency at Long Island Jewish Hospital, followed by specialty training in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Lincoln Hospital, New York Medical College. In 1982, he became a Fellow of The American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons and in 1992 a Fellow in The International Congress of Oral Implantologists.

Dr. Pompa has been a guest lecturer at both Columbia University College of Dental Medicine and New York University College of Dentistry and is now a guest faculty at NYU College of Dentistry.

Dan has lectured extensively, including at the Academy of Osseointegration, the International Interdisciplinary Congress on Craniofacial and Skull Base Surgery, and has presented at the annual Greater New York Dental Meeting numerous times throughout the years. In November 2013, Dr. Pompa became a Seminar Series Speaker/Consultant for the American Dental Association.

Dr. Pompa is an author, having published in such journals as the Journal of the American Dental Association and Dentistry Today, where he has also been listed as a "Leader in Continuing Education." In December 2013, he became an online author for the ADA with the course: "Apical Surgery: To Pull or

Not to Pull." Recently, in the Winter 2014 Journal of NYSAGD, Dr. Pompa published "Update on Basic Physical Diagnosis," which summarizes many new innovations for a simple, chairside medical workup.

Dan is also an inventor, having been issued a U.S. Patent for his innovative work in the field of Dental Implantology (U.S. Patent # 5,320,529).

“The Blood Pressure’s On”

Blood pressure is an everyday screening that takes place in a periodontal office, yet blood pressure is incorrectly measured about half the time as per Blood Pressure Monitoring Journal.

Here are some common mistakes that can cause a blood pressure reading to be elevated by 2 to 20 points and in a patient with hypertension the error is likely be at the higher end.

POSTURE: Sitting with no back support can raise the diastolic (lower #).

ARM POSITION: Upper arm should be supported (not by patient) at heart level. The reading is higher if the arm is below heart level and lower if the arm is above heart level.

FEET POSITION: If feet are dangling or crossed the reading may increase.

TALKING: Casual conversation raises BP

MISCUFFING: Wrapping the cuff around clothing, wrapped too tightly, or too small a cuff can elevate reading as a loose cuff can lead to lower reading.


CAFFIENE: Consuming caffeine 30 mins - 2 hrs. before measurement can elevate reading.

CIGARETTES: Smoking within 30 minutes of reading elevates BP.

BLADDER: A full bladder can raise BP

EXERCISE: Aerobic exercise within 30 mins of measurement can lower reading.

In any case before diagnosing hypertension, the reading should be taken on 2 separate occasions prior to diagnosing and treating.
